Dr Villis has served in the administration of the University of San Diego for over 25 years as a dean, an associate provost, and an institute director. She connects USD to the greater San Diego community, making the university environment especially inviting to students and families.

Cynthia is an advocate in education for students from first generation, low-income, underrepresented and/or disability backgrounds. She is a founding member of the TRiO Alliance of San Diego-Imperial County, and serves on the oversight committee of the TRiO Alliance Research Program.
